Summary:

Reporting to the Division Manager III, Solid Waste Management, the Manager, Solid Waste Engineering & Planning (Project Manager) leads the planning, engineering, and delivery of solid waste engineering and resource recovery projects (i.e., the priority project is the development and construction of a 500 kW Landfill Gas Power Plant) and participates in related multi-disciplinary environmental projects requiring specialist expertise, oversight of staff and consultants and capital budget management.

Qualifications/Experience:

- University undergraduate degree in Engineering, Science, Business, or a related discipline.
- Minimum of 5 years' experience in delivering solid waste services that includes comprehensive project management (preliminary and detailed design, approvals, construction, commissioning) of large waste management capital projects and a minimum of 5 years' experience in a management, supervisory and administrative capacity.
- Registered Professional Engineer (P.Eng.) in the Province of Ontario is an asset.
- Completion of the Project Management Professional program is a significant asset.
- Experience in the public sector is a significant asset.
- Experience with a particular focus on landfill gas projects is an asset.

Specialized Training:

- Must possess a valid class 'G' driver's license.
- Ability to practice and promote the City of London's Corporate Values and Behaviours in all work performed as an employee of the Corporation.
- Demonstrated ability to delegate responsibilities and tasks and ensure that expectations are met.
- Considerable knowledge, skills and abilities in all phases of the project cycle (i.e. conceptualization, preplanning, planning, detailed design, construction, commissioning, benefits realization and transition to maintenance and operations).
- Considerable knowledge in "project management resource recovery" technologies, waste disposal planning and engineering including experience with the Environmental Assessment Act, Environmental Protection Act, Ontario Water Resources Act, Municipal Act, site selection approaches and techniques, and strategic report writing and communications.
- Considerable knowledge with various aspects of the waste management system including garbage collection, recycling, composting, resource recovery, landfilling and related waste management policies and regulations.
- Knowledge and experience with various environmental systems, process and programs that may be applied to the fields of transportation demand management, air quality and urban watershed.
- Considerable knowledge of the roles and responsibilities of each level of government with respect to environmental protection.
- Knowledge of financial, social and environmental impacts as applied to the delivery of waste management systems.
- Ability to plan, organize and manage activities of technical and operational staff, community volunteers and consultant work.
- Ability to establish and maintain effective working relationships with Environmental & Engineering Services Department staff, superiors, elected officials, representatives from other City departments, outside Boards and Commissions, business representatives and the general public.

- Ability to prepare and present complex proposals effectively and efficiently.
- Ability to follow all health and safety rules as set out by City of London policy.
- Ability to deal with the public and landowners adjacent to active and closed landfill facilities in order to maintain a harmonious working relationship.
- Considerable skills in communications which demand sensitivity, knowledge, respect, organization, service orientation and responding to concerns, issues and questions with respect to waste management.
